- **Artist's resume (optional).**
- **Scheduling:** If there are specific time periods you would be *unable* to mount an exhibit, please list them.
- **A self-addressed stamped envelope** for the return of your slides.
- **A check for \$15.00 made out to the Greenbelt Cultural Arts Center.** This application fee is non-refundable.

## About the Exhibition Program

The Greenbelt Arts Center is pleased to invite artists from the metropolitan Washington area to apply for exhibition opportunities in the Center's lobby gallery. Works in all two-dimensional media will be considered, as well as three-dimensional artwork that can be wall hung from picture rail. All other three-dimensional works cannot be accommodated.

Artists selected for the exhibition schedule will be responsible for transportation of their artwork and installation of their exhibition. All artwork

will be insured while on exhibition. Exhibitions will be open to the public during regular lobby hours. The gallery functions as a gathering area prior to dramatic performances and a refreshment service area during intermission, ensuring a great deal of exposure for each exhibit.

The Center will sponsor a reception for each exhibition and will publicize exhibitions through the Center's standard marketing materials. All work submitted does not necessarily have to be available for sale. The Center will charge a 15% commission on any sales during an exhibition.

## Exhibit Space

The wall space available for hanging artwork measures a horizontal linear total of 48' (including an 8' entrance area) and is suitably equipped with halogen track lighting. Note: wall heights vary.
